Natyashastra is the earliest literature on music and drama – written somewhere around 500 BC by Bharata Muni. Comprising 6000 couplets in Sanskrit and spread over thirty-six chapters, Natyashastra’s focus was on dance and drama, with music as an aid. The title is a combination of two Sanskrit words – Natya and Shastra.

Natya, the art of theatre (including dance), was the work of God Brahma, the creator, who was asked to give mankind a fifth Veda, which, unlike the four earlier Vedas, could be understood by everyone, even those who did not know Sanskrit (i.e., the two lowest castes). Thus Brahma created the Natya Veda, with the assistance of other gods.

This field of study was central to the composition of the Vedas. This includes, Amazing Chants, Melodies, Ragas, Tala, Vadya, Melakarta Ragas, Sacrificial ritual, and procedure of Pravargya.More importantly, they got briefing on the Metres as tools for literary architecture. The seven major ancient Sanskrit metres are the three 8-syllable Gayatri, the four 8-syllable Anushtubh, the four 11-syllable Tristubh, the four 12-syllable Jagati, and the mixed Pada metres named Ushnih, Brihati, and Pankti.Beyond these seven metres, ancient and medieval era Sanskrit scholars developed numerous other syllable-based metres (Akshara-chandas). Examples include Atijagati (13x4, in 16 varieties), Sakkari (14x4, in 20 varieties), Atisakkari (15x4, in 18 varieties), Ashi (16x4, in 12 varieties), Atyashri (17x4, in 17 varieties), Dhriti (18x4, in 13 varieties), Atidhriti (19x4, in 13 varieties), Kriti (20x4, in 4 varieties) and so on. They learned The Chandah Sutra and Chandah Shastra.The Anushtubh Vedic metre became the most popular in classical and post-classical Sanskrit works. It is octosyllabic, like the Gayatri metre that is sacred to the Hindus. The Anushubh is present in Vedic texts, but its presence is minor, and Tristubh and Gayatri metres dominate in the Rigveda for example. Dominating presence of the Anushubh metre in the both Ramayana and Mahabharata, that is extremely difficult to get details on the Melodies in Vedic Epics.
